

Outdoor Set-Up: Heavy lifting, setting up tents, barricades, stacking firewood, mostly men for this shift.

Indoor Set-Up: Blowing up balloons, hanging banners and decorating.

Volunteer Check-In: Signing in Volunteers, verifying their personal contact information, and making sure they know their responsibilities. Last shift will spend the last hour of their time helping with cleaning up the volunteer area.

Security: Help prevent “gate crashers” by standing along broad walk or warming hut

Will Call: Assist people with getting their tickets.

Ticket Checkers: Working at the entrance to make sure everyone that comes in has a ticket for the event. If they don't have a ticket, direct them to Will Call.

Fire Barrel: This is for ADULTS ONLY, to man the fire barrels, maintain the fire and make sure everyone is safe around them.

Parking Lot Attendants: Working at one of the pick-up locations or the Lakehouse to help people get on and off the buses. Lakehouse attendants will organize people to get back on buses after firework shows.

Kiddie Rink: Working at the children's skating rink

Costumes/Helpers: Either dress up in a costume or assist a costumed character who will need to wander throughout the event. Costume wearer will need to be of smaller stature.

Dance Tent: This is for Adults ONLY, to supervise teens in the dancing area. It will be in the old boat house.

Refreshments: Monitor volunteer food; make sure we have fresh coffee and hot chocolate. Help prepare noise maker buckets. Last shift will clean-up.

Floater: Fill-in where needed, emptying trash and stocking marshmallows at fire barrels.

Touch a Truck: Assist children and generally help out.

Games: Help run the games

Ice Park: This is new this year. Volunteers will assist children.

Clean-Up: Taking down and cleaning up everything after the event. We need as many people as possible.
